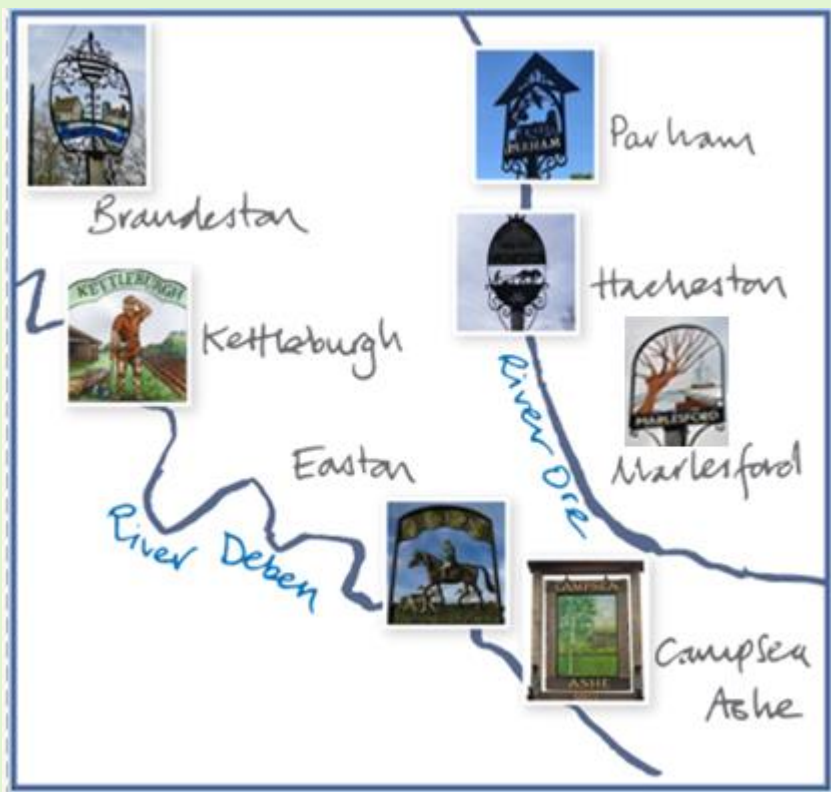

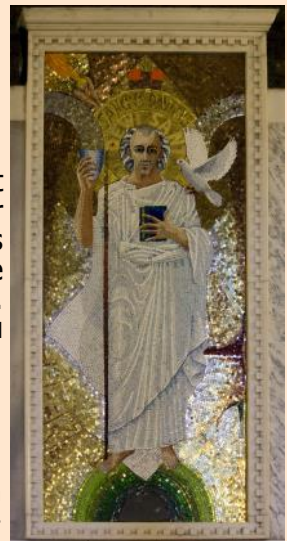


Discussion Group

Parham Parish Council

We were pleased to welcome Charlotte Stanley from Mill Green as a Councillor at our first meeting of the year. Charlotte grew up in Parham as a child and she has now returned to live here with her own children. Charlotte is an NHS nurse and also runs a private ear-cleaning clinic.

We currently have a full Council with all 7 Councillor vacancies filled, but there will be parish (and ward) elections on Thursday 4th May when all seats will be available again. If you are interested in standing as a Parish Councillor, please contact the clerk who can drop a nomination form off to you. Forms need completing and hand-delivering to East Suffolk Council by 4th April. Please note, for the first time, all voters will be required to take photo ID with them when they vote. If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

You can apply for this at www.voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk

If more than 7 candidates apply then Parham will have a contested election which electors will vote on, if not the election will be uncontested. All Councillors will begin their term in office on Tuesday 9th May.

Our next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday 7th March in the meeting room at the Village Hall. We will be discussing plans for the Coronation weekend and preparing for our end-of-year audit. Residents are welcome to attend and can ask questions or suggest items for discussion at a future meeting during the Public Forum.

Looking ahead, please save the date for our **Annual Parish Meeting** and Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council, which will both be held on **Tuesday 23rd May.**

We had a productive meeting in January and are looking at several ways the Parish Council can be modernised.

Hacheston is a small village so a Councillor's work does not take up a lot of time and it is an interesting and rewarding voluntary position. Ukraine Reflection from Dan Poulter

I'm aware the first anniversary of the invasion of Ukraine approaches, by the time you read these lines this sombre date will have just passed.

Like many of you I have been reflecting on the impact this has had across our country and particularly here in Suffolk.

The tragic loss of life in Ukraine is deeply saddening and many people have been forced to flee their homes. The UK response to the crisis has been commendable, not least of all here in Suffolk where, as ever, I've been heartened by the response of our local communities.

I've seen first-hand, the compassion for Ukrainian refugees from residents across Suffolk and it is humbling to witness the way the Ukrainian families have settled into life here, with children attending schools and parents finding work. How difficult attempting a normal life in a foreign country must be, whilst worrying about loved ones forced to stay behind.

As a regular visitor to our local schools, during a recent visit I was delighted to meet with a young Ukrainian student who my parliamentary team and I assisted in settling here. The student is now thriving within the school, and I was impressed to learn how easily they had settled into school and Suffolk life, supported by staff and fellow pupils.

We all remain concerned about what the future holds for Ukraine and hope for a resolution soon.

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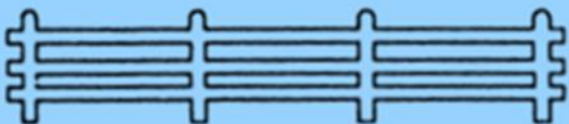


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
