





#### Music@Marlesford

Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> October's concert brought this year's series to a wonderful end. Andrew accompanied Anita Strevens on her cello, and what a sound they gave us. Several people commented that the mellifluous lower notes on the cello were the musical equivalent of rich fruit cake!

Anita had selected and introduced the programme, inspired by the 150 year anniversary of the birth of Ralph Vaughan-Williams, and the pieces played were all by English composers, most of whom had studied at the Royal College of Music. We started with four works by Frank Bridge, moved to a piano recital by Andrew, The Darkened Valley by John Ireland, and then came Vaughan-Williams' English folk songs, gathered when he walked with his great friend Gustav Holst in Suffolk, among other counties.

Next came two composers new to most of the audience – Christopher le Fleming and Rebecca Clarke, who was one of the world's first professional orchestral players.



Rebecca dedicated a passacaglia, on an old English tune to BB, quite possibly Benjamin Britten, who had put on a concert dedicated to Frank Bridges, her teacher at the RCM.

Our evening ended with a set by William Lloyd Webber, whose son Julian is one of the Trustees at ProCorda where Andrew is CEO.

### Remembering Mollie Hayward, aged 102, 1919 - 2022

Mollie was born at Elm Tree Farm Wilby in October 1919. For someone who loved animals, she had a wonderful country childhood. She earned pocket money looking after 60 sitting hens and moving the eggs into incubators. There were outings with other families to the beach at Minsmere for picnics and Mollie remembered bathing machines being pushed out on to the beach at Southwold. We know she used to go hunting a bit, as she stopped us all in our tracks when visiting the Jockey Club for lunch one day, and passing several of Munnings pictures in the corridor, announced that she had been hunting with him and "he was not a very nice man".

Her education was patchy – she remembered being home tutored when young for 2 hours a day, then going to a school in Harleston at 8 years old, followed by Felixstowe College as a boarder aged 10. Her time there was curtailed when she was sent home with septicaemia, then pleurisy and pneumonia, so ill that nursing round the clock was required. Luckily for us, she recovered.

Mollie met Alex Hayward playing tennis in the late 30s, and in 1940 they married and moved in to Ashmoor Hall. There were more chickens to look after and some time spent working for the Red Cross, before Tony arrived in 1942, followed by Jill, Sarah and finally Monica. The war years were not easy – besides running the farm, Alex was in charge of the local Home Guard and was also commandeered to build pill boxes, so he was not home a lot and Mollie had to get on with things.

Mollie's parents were keen race goers and before the war they all went to local point-to-points and even took her to the Derby in 1938. This was to prove an ongoing pastime. She and Alex went to the Grand National and Newmarket was also enjoyed.

**continued** ... In later years, when Mollie and her 3 daughters were on holiday in Ireland and the Derby was on, Mollie insisted on going in to Paddy Power to place a bet – certainly a first for the 3 of them!

Mollie embraced life on the farm, relishing the outdoors and thoroughly enjoying family life. The mantra of "The devil makes work for idle hands" was adhered to fairly strictly and anyone discovered twiddling their thumbs was soon given a job. Sport was to be encouraged and fairly early on a hard tennis court was installed at Ashmoor Hall where much fun was had by all. Mollie played a very active part in the farm business starting a breeding pig herd in the late 50s. She was always extremely interested to know what was happening on the farm & followed carefully the development of the pigs under the stewardship of her grandsons into the Dingley Dell brand.

Following heart problems, sadly Alex died in 1980, leaving Mollie a widow at 60. In her very stoic way, she re-grouped, and the following year ventured overseas for the first time. It was to be the first of many trips, with a variety of travelling companions. There were several trips to Australia to check up on her eldest grandchild James, and in later years Mollie and her 3 daughters enjoyed some truly memorable holidays in the UK, with eyewatering laughter.

She developed macular degeneration in the late 80s which eventually stopped her driving, quite a blow as she had so enjoyed her time delivering Meals on Wheels. In her own pragmatic way Mollie arranged her own transport for shopping and appointments, and she was also heavily involved with starting a local macular support group.

For Mollie's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday an informal party was arranged for her at Easton Farm Park on a Sunday in the summer where all her large family numbering 60 plus were able to gather to celebrate with her. It was a wonderful occasion where she was able to catch up with them all during the course of the afternoon. She had an amazing memory and knew exactly who was who!

Last year, when her physical needs became more pronounced, Mollie decided that the time had come to move to residential care. Adjusting to life at Grove Court in Woodbridge was not easy for her after a lifetime of independence, but she joined in and became a much loved and respected member of the community.

Mollie was a strong, capable & independent lady, but first and foremost, completely family orientated. Her 14 grandchildren have some wonderful memories of her at Ashe — the toy cupboard, the wind-up gramophone, not to mention the sweet cupboard! The next generation, numbering 31, have all enjoyed the same delights!

A remarkable & amazing lady, a wonderful Mother, Grandmother, Great Grandmother & Great Grandmother who will be much missed & well remembered.




